The Cook family has been implementing Best Management Practices (BMPs) on the farm since 1999. BMPs are a set of guidelines that advise producers on how to manage the water, nutrient, and pesticides they are using to reduce agriculture's impact on the state's natural resources. Cook Farm uses a rotational grazing system to improve pasture longevity, allow more timely utilization of forage and conserve surplus forage. The Cook family has fenced off natural wetlands and created a series of man-made ponds in upland areas to protect natural wetland areas. These are just a few of the many BMPs the Cook family practices on a daily basis.

The Cook family is actively involved in their local community. The Cooks have served on the Gilchrist County Soil and Water Conservation District and provide a custom harvesting and application service for the agricultural community. The Cook family is actively involved in their local church.
