Some of the BMPs that have been implemented include GPS Guided Fertilizer Application and fencing off wetlands. By utilizing cross fencing or fencing of sensitive areas, it allows for animal rotation and protection of waterbodies. Tractor's GPS guided fertilizer applications are helpful when applying needed fertilizer to specific areas. These practices ensure that their land will remain productive and viable for future generations.

Dicks is involved in his community as a member of the Hopeful Baptist Church in Columbia County. He also attends meetings that address issues in farming throughout their community as they arise and time permits. When asked why he thinks it is important to protect our environment, Dicks responded, "It is important because we have to live in it and so do our children, as well as future generations.
