Singleton & Sons Farms, Inc. has implemented BMPs for the past 10 years. BMPs are a set of guidelines that advise producers on how to manage the water, nutrient, and pesticides they are using to reduce agriculture's impact on the state's natural resources. Some of the BMPs that have been implemented include GPS guided application of fertilizer, fertilizer branding, subsurface drip irrigation, and tile drain installations. These practices ensure that their land will remain productive and viable for future generations.

Singleton is an active member in his local community by supporting local and state Future Farmers of America chapters and donates to various school organizations.

When asked what he enjoys most about farming, Singleton responded, "I get to enjoy life as being my own boss. Each day has a new set of challenges as well as triumphs. No day is the same. Also, there is no better feeling than being out in the wide open space, and enjoying the environment to its fullest."
