Since 2008, Trent & Sharon Mathews have owned and operated Sweet Season Farms. For more than 140 years, the Mathews family has farmed in Santa Rosa County. Today, the Mathews raise beef cattle and grow corn, soybeans, cotton, peanuts, pumpkins and seasonal flowers. BMP PROGRAM

Mathews Best Management Practices program has been active since 2012. BMP's are based on UF/ IFAS recommendations for natural resource protection on cattle ranches and crops. BMPs implemented includes:

- subsurface drip irrigation
- planting native grasses
- planting cover crops
- variable rate fertilization by GPS
- soil grid sampling
- fencing off areas sensitive to erosion
- rotational grazing
- no-tillage



PARTNERSHIPS

Mathews partners with local youth employing 60-70 young people each fall to gain work experience and life skills at their agri- tourism operation. Providing these youth an opportunity to get involved in agricultural work while earning a meaningful wage is important endeavor to the Mathews family. The young people truly look forward to each season and this year marks the 10th anniversary of the Mathews family opening their farm to the Santa Rosa community!
